HISTORY

The Edenvale Heritage Precinct is an award winning precinct and over 160 years old



The Edenvale Heritage Precinct is strongly connected with the McLarty family, a prominent pioneering family in Western Australia. Edward McLarty, son of pioneer farmers John and Mary McLarty, who arrived in the colony in 1839 from Campbelltown, Scotland, was born in Pinjarra and established strong agricultural and political roots in the area serving on the Murray Roads Board in 1877 and holding the position for nearly 40 years and later elected to the State Legislative Council and held a seat there from 1894 to 1916.

The Liveringa Homestead is the earliest residence in the Precinct, constructed in the 1860s and expanded in 1873-74 when Edward and Mary-Jane McLarty moved into the home after their marriage.

In 1888, wanting a more substantial residence for his wife and seven children, Edward McLarty built the Edenvale Homestead, with this Victorian style homestead standing today for over 130 years and being an award winning heritage listed home of national significance.

The Edenvale Homestead was also home to Sir Duncan Ross McLarty (known as Ross), the youngest child of Edward and Mary-Jane McLarty, and former Western Australia Premier from 1947 to 1953.

ROGER MAY MACHINERY MUSEUM

The Roger May Machinery Museum is named after an iconic character in Piniarra whose passion for vintage machinery, old tractors and carts is legendary. Roger's dedication to restoring historic machinery was the foundation to starting the Museum.

At the Museum, you will find a variety of classic machinery, with most of it still operational, including a fully restored 1938 Ruston 5VOB Stationary Diesel Engine. Only twelve were made originally and this particular one left England in 1925, to disappear for ten vears. Records show that in 1935, the engine arrived at Fremantle, to go on to provide power at the nearby Fairbridge Village. Roger happened to find the parts under a pile of rubbish at Edenvale. It took him two years to restore and is the only known operating example of its kind anywhere in the world.

Though Roger is no longer involved in the day to day running, the Museum is staffed by volunteers just as passionate about restoring the old and displaying for future generations to enjoy!

HERITAGE ROSE GARDEN

The Heritage Rose Garden is a unique and public garden within the Precinct (just over Henry Street).

It is solely dedicated to roses, being the only one in Western Australia. It grows many different kinds of roses including ancient species (wild) roses, spring-flowering European, Chinese, 20th Century ramblers and classic hybrid teas.

The Heritage Rose Garden was first started in the early 1980s by Noel Frost with roses being donated from all over Australia to preserve different species in rose history and celebrate their genetic diversity.

Though the blooming time for roses is usually October, blossoms can be seen year round within the Heritage Rose Garden!





ST JOHN'S CHURCH

The charming 1860s church boasts stunning architectural elements such as leadlight windows and archways with rich wooden features and is considered the fifth oldest church in Western Australia.

The land was first allocated as a church site in 1840 with the first official Sunday service held in 1842. In 1860 the original church building, constructed of 'wattle and daub' was described as 'going to ruins' and in 1861 was replaced by the present St John's Church built by Anthony Cornish for 263 pounds.

Lucky to be standing after nearly being destroyed by fire in 1901, surviving several floods including the most notable and significant being the 1945 flood as well as the Meckering Earthquake in 1968.

In 2019, the Church celebrated more than 150 years of Anglican workshops before becoming deconsecrated. In 2020, the Church received a WA Heritage Award for world-class heritage conservation practices.

WAR MEMORIAL

Originally located within Cantwell Park in 1923 and then on Pinjarra Road following the construction of the Civic Centre in 1966. In 2020 the War Memorial moved to the Glebe Land within the Precinct.

With growing attendance at services in Pinjarra, the Glebe Land provides a respectful environment for the community to reflect in quiet and peaceful moments, commemorate significant historical events and pay our respect to the past and present service men and women.
